

California 65 Warning Requirement for DINP Effective Now

On December 20, 2013, California's Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (OEHHA) added Diisononyl phthalate (DINP) to the Proposition 65 list as carcinogen.

DINP is generally used as a plasticizer in a variety of products including vinyl flooring, wire and cable insulation, stationery, coated fabrics, gloves, toys, tubing, garden hoses, footwear, automobile under-coatings and roofing materials.

Beginning on December 21, 2014 (12 month after the listing date), manufacturers, distributors, or retailers whose products contain DINP and sold in California are required to provide clear and reasonable warnings under the Proposition 65 law.

In addition to DINP, the current Proposition 65 list also includes five other phthalates: Di-n-butyl phthalate (DBP), Di-n-hexyl phthalate (DnHP), Butyl benzyl phthalate (BBP), Di (2-ethylhexyl) phthalate (DEHP), and Di-isodecyl phthalate (DIDP)
